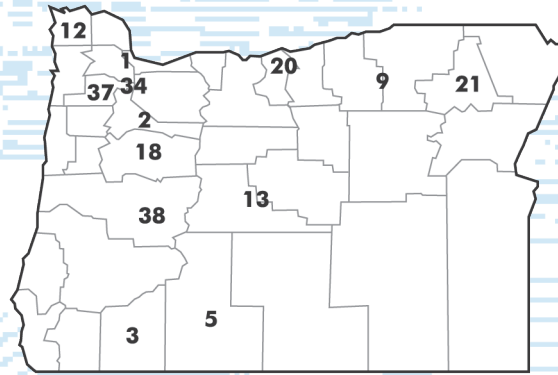

**1947** Dr. Ethel Percy Andrus formed the National Retired Teachers Association (NRTA) as a network for retired educators.

**1955** Oregon Retired Educators Association was organized as a nonprofit organization affiliated with NRTA.

**1958** Dr. Andrus established AARP, the American Association of Retired Persons.

**1982** NRTA and AARP officially merged.
